Highlights of the new ANSI Lockout Standard Z244.1 Lockout/Tagout and Alternative Methods: *Todd Grover, Master Lock Company*

The American National Standards Institute (ANSI) has defined best practices for the control of hazardous energy sources in machinery since 1982. The revision of the ANSI Z244.1 Standard titled The Control of Hazardous Energy – Lockout, Tagout and Alternative Methods, outlines state-of-the-art methodology to enhance the fundamental safety practice of Lockout and offer better protection to people performing potentially hazardous work on machinery, equipment or processes. The ANSI revisions focus on determining the right thing to do to keep workers from harm based on the current knowledge available to us and provide improved personal safety.

A Roadmap for an Electrical Safe Work Practice: *Bob Nicholson, JDRM Engineering*

Developing an Electrical Safe Work Practice program is a difficult task even for trained safety managers because of some of the electrical engineering aspects required in such a document. Air Permitting 101, *Brent Goetz, Ohio Environmental Protection Agency*

Environmental regulations are complex and determining if your business needs an air permit can be confusing. If you are wondering whether you need an air permit, this first session is for you. Topics covered include the basic steps in evaluating all emission sources, documenting exemptions, and getting a permit for those that need one. The types of permits available, including general permits, permit-by-rule options, and permits-to-install-and-operate (PTIO). Authorized pre-permit construction activities will be discussed. Finally, an overview of how to complete permit application data, calculate emissions of criteria and air toxic pollutants and work with your district office will be provided.

This session continues with an overview of record keeping and reporting requirements contained in a typical air permit. Attendees will receive practical advice on how to keep on top of reporting responsibilities and stay in compliance,

including the reporting of equipment malfunctions and completing fee emission reports
